Autumn Jubilee Row Quilt Finishing Carole Carter From My Carolina Home

Start by cutting and/or constructing background sashing strips.

Six background sashing strips 2-1/2-inches x 48-1/2-inches Two background side strips 2-1/2-inches x 61-1/2-inches.



Sew a background sashing strip 2-1/2-inches x 48-1/2-inches between the rows, at the top and at the bottom. Add the two side sashing strips 2-1/2-inches x 61-1/2-inches to the sides. When you finish this step, the top will measure 52-1/2 inches x 61-1/2 inches.

Add borders as you like.

If you want to duplicate mine, cut at least 112 bricks $2-1/2 \times 3-1/2$ inches. This will give you some leeway in colors if you get the same ones on the ends. Cut four squares 3-1/2-inches square for the corners. Chain stitch, or make as leader-ender pieces, sewing the long sides together. Measure your top, and sew borders as usual. The scrappy bricks will not fit exactly, so take up any excess length using the previous seam lines on random areas between the bricks before sewing to the top. This will make them all look the same, even though some will be a smidgen smaller. I have 31 on the long sides, and 26 on the short sides, not including the 3-1/2-inch squares in the corners.

Add a final border in a width of your choice, using the Measure and Cut method. Mine is 4-inches in width. Quilt and bind as usual.

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
